

REFUND POLICY

Note that students who do not complete their coursework within the course time period must re-register for the course(s), pay tuition and other required fees, and start the course over again.

Withdrawal and Cancellation

Cancellation occurs when a student terminates a course of study before beginning it. Withdrawal occurs when a student terminates a course of study after Andrews University begins providing educational services. The drop (or withdrawal) fee, as applicable, is \$35.

- The withdrawal fee is charged to your student account. Pay in the same manner you paid to register, before you request your transcript.
