








1st to 2nd Year Transfers' Retention Rates






6-yr Graduation & Transfer Rates by Cohort year














UG Student-Faculty Ratio

Research Score per Full-time Faculty









Service Activities Senior Survey 2015-16, n=367






Involvement in Service

Involvement in Leadership







Average Tuition Discounts












Total New Undergraduate Transfers






IPEDS 12-Month Headcounts & FTE's vs Credits






Graduate vs Undergraduate 12-Month FTE's





Online, 12-mo Unduplicated Headcount
