- The Global Leadership Institute (GLI) at Andrews University is a collaborative leadership development initiative supported by the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. The mission of GLI is to promote the development of Adventist leaders for the worldwide church.
- 2. The Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary obtained a Lilly Endowment grant to establish the Andrews University Center for Community Change. This crucial project trains pastors and others to make a difference in their communities. Studies have shown that Adventist churches grow when they combine traditional outreach methods with community engagement.
- 3. In our often broken world, the work of our International Center for Trauma Education & Care, part of our School of Social Work, is crucial as it reaches out to train denominational leaders, pastors and others so they can support individuals affected by trauma. This Center has helped fulfill Andrews University's legacy of mission with its remarkable projects in Ethiopia, Cambodia, Thailand and eSwatini, as well as in the United States.
- For service closer to home, we just celebrated our seventh annual Change Day at Andrews

University where more than 1,200 students, faculty, staff and administrators dedicated this day to live out our mission and make a difference in the lives of others, participating in more than 40 community service projects in our greater community.


In 2024 we celebrate the 150th Anniversary—the sesquicentennial—of two profound events in the history of the Seventh-day Adventist Church: (1) the sending of the first sponsored missionary of the Church, J.N. Andrews, who sailed with his children to Europe in September 1874 to serve and help Change the World for God, and (2) the founding that same month of the first Seventh-day Adventist higher education institution, Battle Creek College, now operating as Andrews University and named in honor of J.N. Andrews.

Throughout 2024 we will have the remarkable opportunity to celebrate the anniversary of this journey of faith and mission for our University and the Seventh-day Adventist Church with the theme of "Founded in Faith. Forward in Mission."

I want to assure you that at Andrews

ABOUT OUR CAMPUS

- Consists of 2,400 acres on the St. Joseph River, 12 miles from Lake Michigan.
- Includes 26 instructional buildings, four residence halls, four apartment complexes, three libraries, an astronomy observatory, a 50,000-watt FM radio station, a performing arts center, two eateries, three museums, airpark, and wellness center.
- An officially registered arboretum, with more than 500 labeled trees and 150 species.
- Andreasen Center for Wellness: The Wellness Club features an indoor track, group fitness classes, individual cardio & weight machines, a saltwater pool, saunas, a spacious lobby, outdoor garden and more.

- WAUS: This campus-based FM station is Michiana's leading source of classical music.
- Howard Performing Arts Center:

STUDENTS AND FACULTY

 University, and an additional 528 Andrews
 University students enrolled in global partner, affiliate and extension programs.
- Additionally, 2,624 students were enrolled in ongoing professional development coursework through the School of Education during 2022–2023.
