How To Sign Up

You will have to sign up for 6 credits of required classes) for Summer 2016 including BHSC440 Cultural Psychology, RELG360 Comparative Spirituality, and BHSC375-040 which is the tour itself. There is also a \$300 deposit that is non-refundable after airline tickets have been purchased. That will cover most expenses (2+ meals/ day, travel, lodging). Plan on bringing spending money for water, extra food, and shopping.

Details of a Tour Follow These Steps

- Sign up at 211 Buller Hall
- · Fill out application form & turn it in
- Deposit \$300
- Check your passport and ensure that it expires after November 15, 2016
- Register for Summer Semester BHSC375-040, BHSC440-040 (3) and RELG360-040 (3)
- Intensive classes begin May 2, 2016
 Trip is May 8-16, 2016
- Check that your luggage meets the luggage requirements.
- Show up ready to go to Peru

Rules of the Road

Group Think: Between Andrews, Loma Linda, and LaSierra Universities, we've led no less than 35 study tours to Peru. In short, you'll need to be in the right place at the right time. So be in place, on task, and on time. Then later – on your own – return to the Andes and Amazon with a backpack and do your own thing.

Schedules: As often happens with travel, slight changes may have to be made so be alert for postings in hotel lobbies and announcements for changes in schedules and itinerary.

Luggage: wheeled luggage is best since you tote your own bags. Checked luggage size should be:12x14x22 inches. Carry-ons are limited to a 17lbs bag or case plus a purse or (small) backpack. (NO knives, files, liquids in excess of 3oz in carry-ons). Have secure luggage tags complete with name, phone number, and address on checked bag and carry on (do not rely on flimsy paper tags provided by the airline).

Packing: 1 Jacket, 1 warm sweatshirt, hat, 3 jeans or slacks, pajamas, toiletries (insect repellent with DEET!), flashlight, underwear, 3-4 shirts, socks, camera, sunglasses, plastic rain poncho. In day pack: 20 granola bars, bag of wrapped candy for kids on the Amazon, school supplies in a bag. Laundry available (at a cost) in Cusco.

Attitude: leave your attitude at home. Hum this mantra: "Tour Uncle and Aunties know best..."

Dress: Avoid clothing that is immodest or has suggestive printing. In the jungle, because of mosquitos (and chiggers in the grass), long pants are strongly suggested.

Sleeping In: sleeping – as with alchemy and spirits and going to bed late and being left behind as the plane pulls out – constitute mortal sins.
