Master of Arts in Pastoral Ministry

The MA in Pastoral Ministry is a collaborative arrangement between the NAD Union conferences and the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University. This 48-credit master's degree is delivered in each Union via five-day field-based intensives. It is designed for mature pastors who hold a bachelor's degree and have served in a ministry role for at least five years. This degree provides ministerial education for Adventist pastors employed by NAD conferences who otherwise could not attend traditional on-campus classroom learning. Tuition is subsidized by the Unions and the Seminary.
